CONNECTING, COORDINATING, AND EXPANDING THE KNAER NETWORK

For example:

- Identifying activities, resources, mechanisms that may be better connected and coordinated (e.g. websites, social media, events, and activities) to reduce duplication and maximize resources and impact

PROVIDING ACCESS TO TOOLS & RESOURCES

For example:

- Publication of network tools and resources on KNAER website
- Invite network members to submit OERE research summaries and blog posts sharing knowledge mobilization and subject matter expertise.

Knowledge Hub: In collaboration with KNAER networks, the Secretariat will develop a KNAER Knowledge Hub designed to showcase and provide free, open access to tools and resources developed by KNAER networks and the Secretariat. Tools and resources will focus on network priority areas and knowledge mobilization.

Ontario Education Research Exchange (OERE):

The OERE (http://oere.oise.utoronto.ca/) provides free access to short summaries of education research, written in clear and accessible language. Many of our summaries have been accessed over 1000 times and the OERE invites KNAER networks to contribute summaries of education research to its website repository, which will be included in the Knowledge Hub. Research summaries added to the OERE website will be promoted via KNAER social media channels that reach out to over 3000 followers!
